Directions to St Paul's Lutheran School (A-Team Volleyball on Thurs, Sep 20)

Take Hwy 16 east to the Hwy 83 exit. Go south (right) on Hwy 83 to Mukwonago. In Mukwonago, take Hwy ES (Main St) south (right) to East Troy. Turn west (right) on Hwy 20 (North Ave). The school will be approximately ¼ mile on the left side (2665 North St, East Troy).

Directions to St John's Lutheran School (Volleyball on Thurs, Sep 27)

Take Hwy 16 east to the Hwy 83 exit. Turn south (right) on Hwy 83 and continue approximately 17 miles to Mukwonago. At the first traffic light in Mukwonago, turn west (right) onto West Veterans Way (formerly County Road NN). The school will be on the right (410 West Veterans Way, Mukwonago, WI 53149)

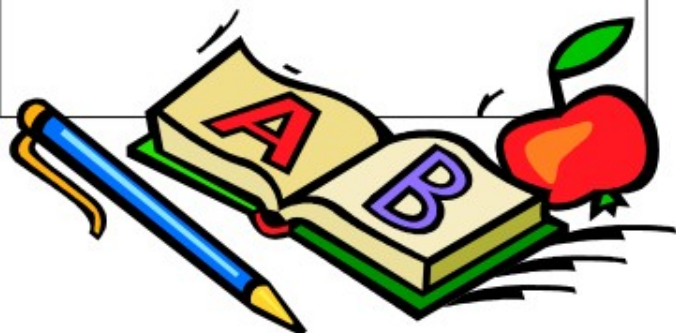
